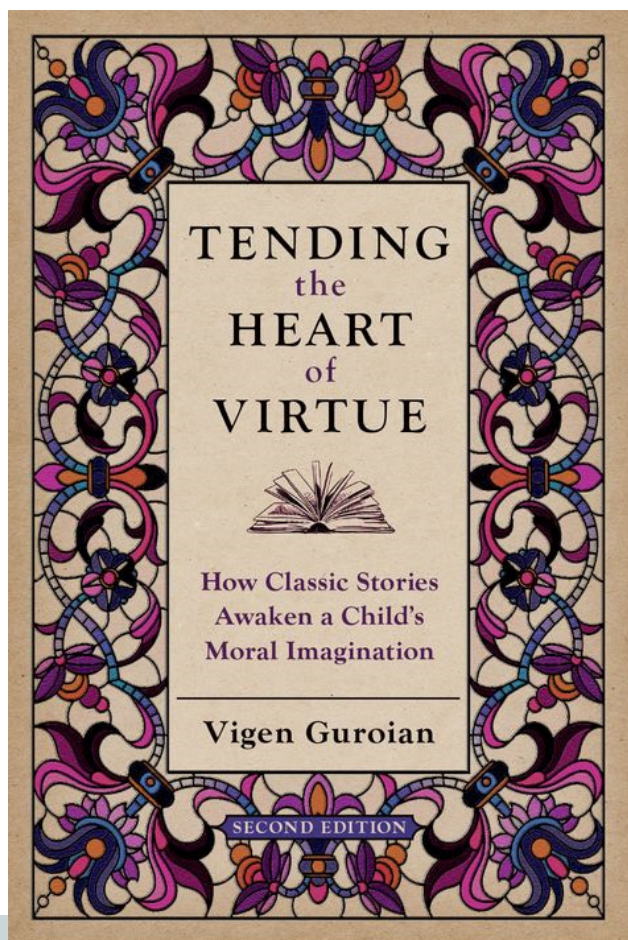


Tending the Heart of Virtue
